Type of accommodation	We highly recommend that you stay in university accommodation (Halls of Residence).		
	Newman has 202 single study bedrooms in Halls on-campus. Many of our Halls have been recently upgraded and rooms are fully furnished. A new hall of residence will be available in late 2017.		
Accommodation Fees	New Halls - £2430.00		
	Existing halls - En-suite - £2304.00 - Standard room with shared bathroom - £1791.00		
Facilities	Standard bedrooms are single study rooms with hand basin and shared bathroom facilities.		
	There are a limited number of en-suite rooms available. The en-suite rooms are single study bedrooms with hand basin and a private bathroom.		
	Students are required to bring their own bedding and any kitchen utensils they require or they are able to purchase a bedding pack at £25.00 each from the Housekeeping Department, with £15.00 being refunded when the bedding pack is returned in good condition.		
	Newman's Halls of Residence are self-catered and there are shared kitchens in Halls of Residence which include a fridge, freezer, cooker, microwave, toaster, kettle, lockable cupboard space and seating area.		
	You can prepare meals and snacks in the communal kitchens or visit the on-campus food court, the Sanctuary (open Monday to Friday), which provides a range of reasonably priced meals, sandwiches and refreshments.		
	There are also a variety of vending machines on campus offering snacks and hot and cold beverages. The launderette in Halls is available 24 hours a day. Wi-Fi is also available in Halls.
