# The Idea of a University

Our ambition is based firmly on Catholic values and a proud commitment to the principles of social justice. Our educational aspiration is founded on the traditions of Catholic social teaching; emphasising human dignity, subsidiarity, solidarity, stewardship, social justice and a commitment to the common good. Oscar Romero set out this purpose when he said:

the mind of the student a hope of becoming rich and having the power to dominate. Let us form in the heart... the idea of loving, of preparing oneself to serve and giving oneself to others."

Recognising that a university also had a valuable, pragmatic dimension, our Patron, Saint John Henry Newman, was convinced that the pursuit of knowledge was desirable for its own sake. In his inspirational work, The Idea of a University, he wrote:


"If then a practical end must be assigned to a university course, I say it is that of training good members of society. It is the education

which gives a person a clear conscious view of their own opinions and judgements, a truth in developing them, and eloquence in expressing them, and a force in urging them."

At Newman University we continue to hold fast to these ideas, striving to realise them in our practice. As a small, friendly, single campus institution, we also seek to embrace that sense of community "Let us not develop an education that creates in which is manifested in the Catholic ethos of welcoming all; regardless of religious belief, race, ethnic origin or background.

- Engaging with our alumni to connect us with local, national and international organisations and groups


