



Visiting us

By Public Transport

There's direct bus links to both Birmingham city centre and the Merry Hill Centre from campus, plus areas such as Harborne, Northfield and Halesowen. Visit journeyplanner.networkwestmidlands.com to plan your journey.

If you're travelling by train from stations on the Nottingham to Cardiff route or the Birmingham to Hereford route, we recommend taking a direct train to University station and then taking the X64 bus service from stop QE. If you're travelling from other stations, we recommend changing at Birmingham New Street for Kings Norton station and taking the 18 bus. Alternatively, Newman is about 10 minutes by taxi from either University or Kings Norton station.

By Car or Cycle

There's free car parking on campus. For the Open Day, you can park in our staff and student car parks, as well as the Sailing Club car park opposite. There's also bike storage outside the main entrance. Use the postcode B32 3NU if you're using satellite navigation.
