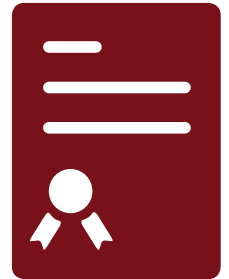

As the first of its kind in the UK, this Applied Humanities accelerated degree means that you can complete your study over two years, and graduate with real-life expertise.

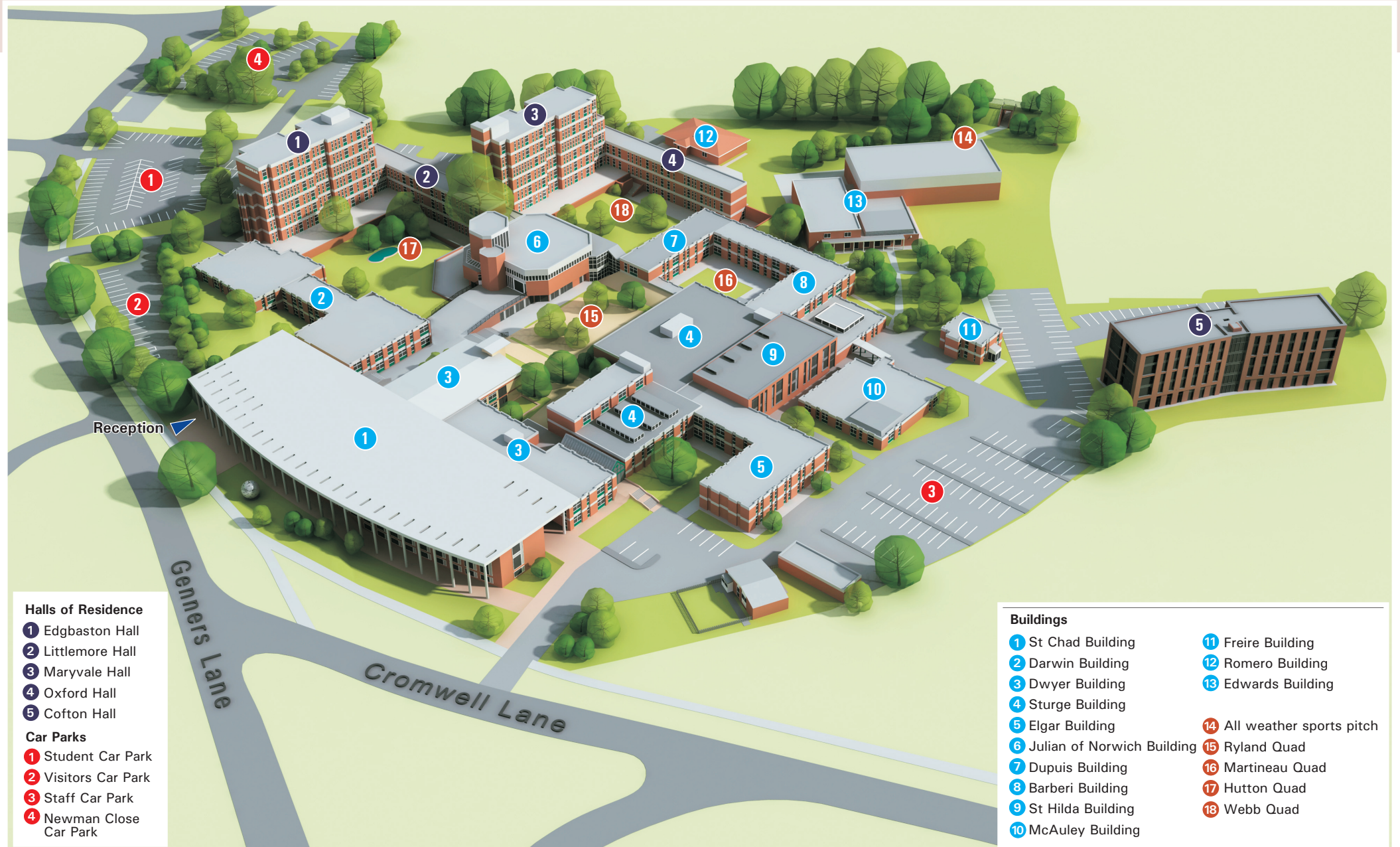
Catering on Campus
