In doing so, they are empowered to drive and effect changes accordingly.

Purpose and scope

Terms of Reference

- To promote and implement the enhancement of the student experience
- To help manage student expectations and two way communications with students
- To monitor and ensure that work undertaken is in line with the Strategic Framework, the Student Success Strategy and the Student Charter
- To receive regular reports from other appropriate committees and task groups (e.g. Learning, Teaching, Assessment and Quality Committee; Retention and success task group), and take appropriate actions
- To use key data, relevant information and research to inform and enhance the overall student experience, keeping in mind the nature of the University and its engagement within the Community.
- To ensure a joined up approach with the Learning, Teaching and Academic Quality Committee, whilst not duplicating/replicating discussions/work from the Learning, teaching and Academic Quality Committee.
